Fluid thoughts

The ancient art of watercolor painting probably originated from the cave paintings in Paleolithic Europe over 30,000 years ago. The use of this medium is also evident in the illustrated papyrus manuscripts of the Egyptian Pharaohs and the European Middle Ages. Renaissance, however, initiated the use of watercolor as an art medium where the wildlife, botanical and landscape paintings of Albrecht Dürer (1471–1528), introduced a new genre of watercolor painting. Some early specialists of this medium include Claude Lorrain, Van Dyck, Benedetto Castiglione, and numerous Flemish and Dutch painters.

The art of watercolor is also gathering a rich history in this region where some very experienced artists continue to innovatively use this medium with commitment. Sarfraz Musawir is one such artist who is scrupulous in handling this delicate medium intelligently rather than with unrestricted freedom and casual whim. His seasoned acumen to express defty with aquarelle gives him the ability to create vibrant ambiences of bustling cityscapes under diverse conditions of light and weather. The dynamic addition of exquisitely painted pedestrians, rickshaws and vehicles grant the paintings a corporeal spirit; something that very few artists can do. The noteworthy use of glazed strokes with calculated transparencies; the premeditated deployment of the hand-made paper's grain; and most of all, the chosen range of lively colors, give Musawir's painting an eminent identity.

Although executed with an expressionistic hand, Musawir's paintings appear to be pleasantly realistic with a hint of contemporary flavor. His choice of subjects is a perpetual emphasis on the evolving culture; it is more like recording history with a compassionate eye. When seen through the eyes of the painter, the cityscapes leave a lasting impression on the viewers; to some it would appear to be a déjà vu while others would find it an absorbing experience.

Rainwater laden road scenes with misty reflections of people and the environment are perhaps the most unique works for their multiple visual characteristics. Creating an atmosphere of inclement weather, the shimmering light, falling rain and the glistening roads; all in one, is a task that requires years of experience and devotion. It is only through sincere grooming of the eye that one develops a compassion for meaningful observation.

The landscapes chosen by the artist, it seems, are the ones that daunt him the most. Musawir perhaps likes to dare himself to accept the most mystifying compositions; for example, the painting made from a roof-top is a bold initiative where the depth and perspective collectively pose a huge challenge to the artist's observation. Here again, the warmer foreground and the cooler background, along with an appreciation of gradually fading objects under a situation of a dual perspective, one of height and the other of distance, manifest the artist's perception of the medium.

Musawir's paintings of shrines and monuments reflect an air of respect and reverence which can actually be felt the moment one casts an eye on his work. The virtuous ambiance drenched in sobriety and sanctity is unmistakable in every such project that the artist undertakes. A paradigm of purity, Musawir's fluid strokes and intuitive washes, unravel the saintliness of sacred monuments impressively. Furthermore, the treatment of historical buildings with versatile techniques places Musawir amongst the leading watercolorists who paint buildings with impressionistic fervor.









Sarfraz Musawir born 1960 in Umerkot Sindh, Pakistan is one of the most prominent names amongst Pakistani watercolor artists.

He graduated with a Master's degree in Physics from University of Sindh and attained First Class in Diploma in Fine Art from Karachi School of Art. He is well known for his depiction of scenery, cityscapes, landscapes and portraits.

After exploring the restless "watercolorist" within, Musawir presented his work in various group shows and numerous solo exhibitions, nationally and internationally, that clearly portrait his passion of water color paintings. He also participated in the International Watercolor Society Festival, held in Izmir, Turkey, 2013. He was awarded First Prize in Sadequain Awards in 1994.

The dripping colors off his brush have rejuvenated the clichéd, although always evergreen, subject of the walled city of Lahore along with its famous gates and street life within and around.

His unique technique adds a shimmering effect in his frames and enhances the colors against a relatively diffused sky. Earlier, in his quest of creating atmospheric vivacity with his watercolors, the artist recorded the shades of Karachi in the same documentary-like manner. His interest in the architecture makes him a keen observer of his surroundings and his paintings a diary of a traveler, passing through the streets of the metropolis instead of standing at a single point and imitating everything objectively.
